Question of the Week: Now that my weeds are growing again, can I safely use a product like Roundup®?

In addition to the active ingredients, Roundup® also contains "inactive" ingredients and research suggests that one of these, polyethoxylated tallowamine, (POEA), is not safe for humans or other animals

and has caused higher instances of miscarriages. Laboratory research on cows, mice and rats has shown detrimental effects including kidney and liver damage. Reports abound of pets that abruptly died after exposure to Roundup® treated properties. The EPA is expected to conduct a review of Roundup® by 2015 to determine if the herbicide should be taken completely off the market. Roundup® is now off the shelves in much of Canada, it is illegal to sell or apply it for cosmetic lawn care in Ontario and in Boulder, Colorado. It has been banned in parts of Argentina and in areas of the United States such as Cape Cod; citizens are strongly objecting to utility company use of Round-up type herbicides.
